


FOOD FOR FINES!



We will waive \$2.00 in library fines for every non-perishable, unexpired food item donated. (to a max. of \$20.00 or 10 items per person.) All food collected will go to the Flagler County Food Bank and/or Feed Flagler Program. Offer only for late fines does not include lost or damaged material, processing fees, ILL fees, passport & photo fees or replacement card fees. Waiver applies only to overdue fines currently assessed (no future credit applied.) Acceptable food donations include non-perishable, un-expired canned or packaged food. (Please no candy)

EBOOKS ARE HERE!



Flagler County Public Library has joined other member libraries in our consortium called NEFLIN (Northeast Florida Library Network) in an effort to offer our residents ebooks in the most cost effective way. Through this partnership we we will have greater purchasing power and be able to offer MORE ebooks than we could with our limited funds. To read eBooks, users will need Adobe® Digital Editions. Titles can be enjoyed immediately or transferred to a variety of devices, including iPod®, Sony® Reader™, and many others. Some audio titles can also be burned to CD to listen on-the-go. Titles will automatically expire at the end of the

lending period. There are no late fees!

All you need is your Flagler County Public Library Card to get started and your "pin" number. The pin number is the last four digits of your phone number that we have on file for you. If you don't remember please call the library at 386-446-6763 and we will be glad to help you.

So now you probably want to know how many and for how long? Each card holder may check out a maximum of 5 titles for 14 days. If a title is already checked out by another patron, you can also place a hold on a total of 5 titles. When the title is available a hold notification is sent to your email and you will then have 3 days to pickup that title before it is sent to the next user on the waiting list.

Please remember that due to publisher restrictions libraries are not able to provide ebooks for every author. There are several publishers that will not sell to libraries! Check our ebook page for more information on this topic. Also you may suggest titles to purchase on the NEFLIN Overdrive site but due to funding and publisher restrictions we may not be able to fill every request.

Saturday, November 10:


