Agriculture:

According to the 2007 Census of Agriculture (the latest figures) Flagler County has 82 farms that raise beef, vegetables (cabbage, potatoes, peppers, and squash), sod grass, ornamental plants, specialty crops (such as blueberries) and other animals (goats). There are 58,000 acres in production in Flagler County and the market value of the crops and livestock sold is \$34,140,000. The industry employs approximately 4,008 full and part time employees.
