

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER
Plantation Bay WTP Drinking Water Problem Corrected

Customers of Plantation Bay WTP have been notified in previous months of a problem with our drinking water. We are pleased to report that the corrective action taken to minimize levels of the Disinfection Byproducts (DBPs), which includes Total Trihalomethanes (TTHMs) and Haloacetic Acids (HAA5s), has adequately lowered the levels below the maximum contaminant levels (MCLs). The standard for TTHMs is 80 micrograms per liter ($\mu\text{g/L}$) and the standard for HAA5s is 60 $\mu\text{g/L}$. At Sudbury Lift Station, the average level of TTHMs over the last year was 53.09 $\mu\text{g/L}$ and the average level of HAA5s was 24.71 $\mu\text{g/L}$. At Aldenham Lift Station, the average level of TTHMs over the last year was 51.80 $\mu\text{g/L}$ and the average level of HAA5s was 24.39 $\mu\text{g/L}$.
